CRUCIAL INFORMATION REGARDING HOME INSURANCE POLICIES

Few among us are aware that most home insurance policies in Canada have a clause regarding home absence. (generally 96 hours or more) Here is what it consists of:

GENERAL EXCLUSIONS:

Unoccupancy:

A clause in every policy states that if your home is unoccupied for more than 96 consecutive hours during the heating season, coverage against water escape caused by freezing or defective plumbing applies only if you have made arrangements for a competent individual to check your premises on a daily basis.
